Every September, thousands of people come together across England to celebrate their heritage, community, and history.

This year we saw our festival community become the largest it has ever been with more than 2,350 organisations, individuals and community groups involved in putting on free events. The number of festival visits increased this year, up by 20% on 2023.

More than ever, the importance of a free festival of history and culture shone through this year, with 44% of visitors stating they would not have visited had events not been free.






#### It's FREE to access

Heritage Open Days is founded on the principle of free entry. This year 35% of audiences came from a C2DE background.
